## SJEC Celebrates its 50<sup>th</sup> Anniversary

The San Joaquin Engineers Council will celebrate its 50th anniversary at its annual banquet to be held in February of 2017. The 50th Engineer of the Year will be named as well at this years Distinguished Service Award recipient. All living past recipients of the Engineer of the Year, as well as this year's Distinguished Service Award recipients have been invited to attend the festivities, about 48.

In 1966, several engineers from differing disciplines got together to form a social group, to assist students wishing to become engineers, and to honor an engineer that made contributions to the Engineering community. The group called themselves the San Joaquin Joint Engineers Council. Later the name was changed to San Joaquin Engineers Council during incorporation as a non profit Corp.

## **National Engineers Week**

George Washington was a Land Surveyor. In his honor, Engineers Week activities generally take place in February, during the week that contains his birthday. This year Engineers Week will take place during the week of February 21<sup>st</sup> to the 27<sup>th</sup>.

The San Joaquin Engineers Council (SJEC) sponsors various programs promoting the role of engineering in today's society. Programs include:

- "Math Counts" competition for middle school students
- San Joaquin Delta College Engineering & Technology Day
- San Joaquin Engineers Council Scholarship and Awards Banquet

The SJEC will award scholarships to a number of high school seniors who plan to pursue careers in engineering. Interested students from high schools in San Joaquin, Calaveras, Stanislaus, Tuolumne, and Amador Counties were contacted and a number of applications were received. Finalists are chosen through an evaluation of their grades, community activities, and personal interviews.

SJEC may also award scholarships to community college students enrolled in an engineering curriculum who will be transferring to a four-year college to complete their education.

## **Engineer of the Year Award**

Each year SJEC accepts nominations for the Engineer of the Year (EOY) Award. Nominees are registered engineers who have given freely of their time and services for the benefit of the Engineering profession and the community. A committee made up of past EOY Award recipients makes the final selection. The Engineer of the Year will be honored at the SJEC Awards Banquet.

This year, the committee selected Steve Essoyan of Knife River Construction. Mr. Essoyan began his career with DSS Company in 1984 and has held various positions at DSS and its successor Knife River Construction, including estimator, project manager, chief estimator, executive vice president, president, and currently Regional President.

## **Distinguished Service Award**

Each year SJEC accepts nominations for the Engineering Profession Distinguished Service Award. Nominees are individuals who have given freely of their time and services for the benefit of the engineering profession and the community.

This year there are two recipients of the Distinguished Service Award and they are Evangelina and John Paoluccio. Evangelina Paoluccio is a Registered Civil Engineer and has been involved with the MathCounts competition since 2009 and has acted as co-chair of the silent auction and raffle held during our annual banquet. John Paoluccio is a Mechanical Engineer and the President of Inventive Resources, Inc. that manufactures products for storm water pollution control and sewer odor elimination.

Winners receive trophies and a chance to compete at the State Competition and National MathCounts competition.

Last year our MathCounts student from Monte Vista Middle School, Wentinn Liao placed 2nd place in the National Team (out of 50 teams representing each State!) and twelfth overall out of 224 Mathletes!

The competition will be held on Saturday <u>February 4th</u> <u>2017</u> from 8am-2pm at the University of the Pacific School of Engineering and Computer Science. On Friday February 3, 2017, San Joaquin Delta College will host its Engineering and Technology Day. SJEC is proud to sponsor this event providing graders, proctors, awards, and refreshments.

Approximately 125 high school students interested in engineering and technology will arrive at Delta College and participate in career orientation programs. Teams of students will compete in a "Delta Cube" design project where a ping pong ball introduced on one side of the cube will have to touch all of the six inside surfaces and exit on the opposite side. Additionally, there will be a robotic vehicle project and students will compete in computer and hand drafting competitions.

On Saturday, **February 11, 2017**, Delta College will also be hosting the regional SkillsUSA competition. This organization allows high school and community college students to compete in over 100 different leadership and skill competitions, and if successful, move on to state and national competitions. ### **Scholarship Contributions**

SJEC's Scholarship Award Program is unique. There is no other similar organization where engineers and allied professionals come together to support students wishing to pursue an engineering education.

SJEC's only source of financial support for scholarship awards given to students and its other activities is contributions from engineers, businesses, contractors, individuals, and allied professionals.

Since 1979, SJEC has awarded over a quarter of a million dollars in scholarships to 233 deserving students. In 2016, SJEC awarded 5 scholarships totaling \$10,000. SJEC and its member organizations represent 1,200 engineers, design firms, and allied professionals.

Currently, SJEC awards three classes of scholarships, 1) SJEC's General Scholarships, 2) one Wilson Sanguinetti Scholarship, and 3) one Robert Skaggs Memorial Scholarship.

We would like to expand our scholarship program to grant more and larger awards. Obviously, this will require additional and larger contributions. We have set up five classes of contributions:
